


#### Newsletter December 2024


Now, each Monday morning in the "warm room", cafe style tables are set up, the kettle and oven goes on and parents and carers visit with their little ones to start the new week together.

## Walk

As we reflect on another bumper year, we're amazed at how God has used BiG KIDS in his big plan!

#### 2024 has included:

- Boro Cereal; our pioneering social action project which was devised, led and presented by the children of four local Primary schools
- delivering the message of Jesus' death and resurrection to approximately 1600 children during 30 school sessions in 10 days over the Easter period
- coordinating the Kids work as part of Festival Teesside, which saw 27,000 people interact with the local church network
- founding Barney's Baby Bank for the families of Linthorpe and Ayresome to further build and strengthen connections in our local community
- supporting other churches, such as; St John's,
   Middlesbrough Community Church, Christ Church and St Martin's in their delivery of regular faith based teaching for children
- continuing to make videos and songs for our online resources
