




# WELCOME

### School

At the start of October, we welcomed some new (and a few old) friends who were visiting from Immanuel Baptist Church in Tennessee. They returned to serve at St Oswalds and St Chad's Church, alongside the Genesis Project.

The week was full of amazing moments and opportunities. We visited 3 local schools, lead a Harvest Toddler Service, thanksgiving themed kids club and much more.



Our schools work kicked off with Harvest assemblies in both Beech Grove and Newham Bridge Primary, before we spent two lovely days in Beverley School, running Bible drama lessons for kids from Primary, Secondary and Sixth Form age groups.

They all had so much fun, learning about parables and acting them out with props and costumes. From inflatable pigs to sheep hair bands, hi-viz jackets to ponchos! We laughed lots and remembered the stories of; the Good Samaritan, Wise and Foolish Builders, Lost Sheep and Prodigal Son.

At MCC we explored the importance of remembering Jesus' sacrifice for us, through the fantastic Disney film, Coco, and the Mexican tradition of "Day of the Dead".
